You Don't Die Among Friends (*Unter Freunden Stirbt Man Nicht*) is the German adaption of the Israeli series *Stockholm*, based on Noa Yedlin's book of the same name.

Just days before potentially fulfilling his lifelong ambition, Hermann - a leading contender for this year's Nobel Prize in Economics - is found dead in his bed, after apparently suffering a cardiac arrest.

Hermann's four closest friends, who have known him for the past 50 years, make an extraordinary decision together to help him achieve his life's dream posthumously. What if they could bury a Nobel Prize winner? Together they form a plan to keep him "alive" - in other words, hide his death - for five days, allowing him to "die" with this extraordinary honor to his name.

What seems like a relatively simple task quickly turns into an overwhelmingly complicated challenge, one that tests the very limits of their bonds as friends. Their attempts to keep a secret go wrong time and time again - leaving viewers to wonder exactly how far will they go to help Hermann die a Nobel Prize winner? And is it really all in the name of friendship?
